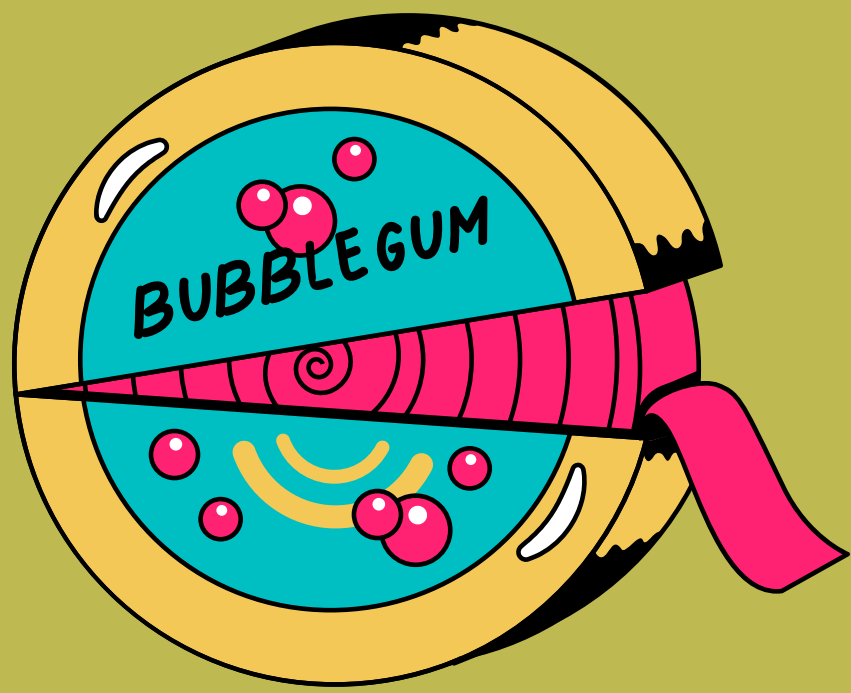

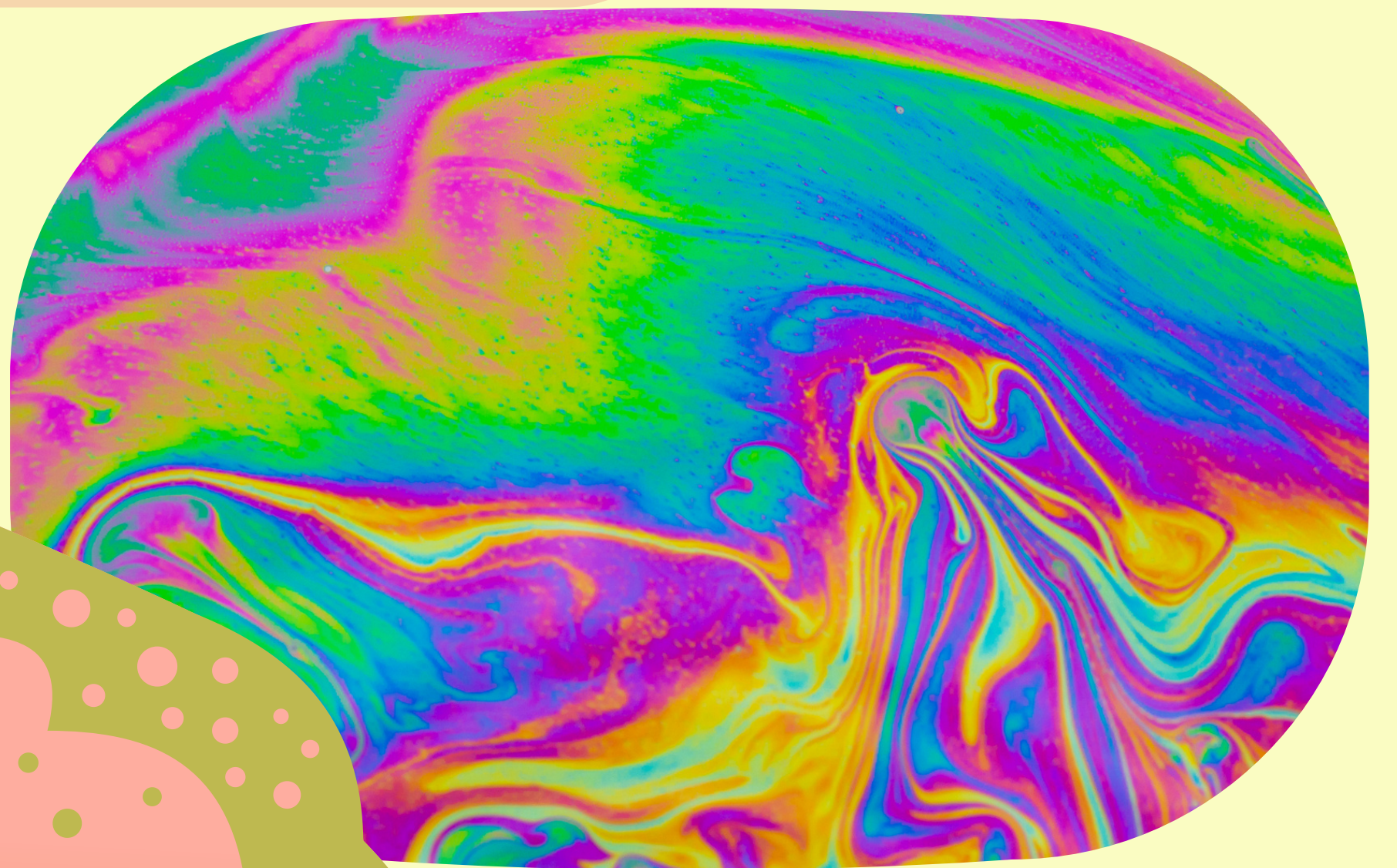

  - a. Look out for an email detailing how/where to pickup your campus card

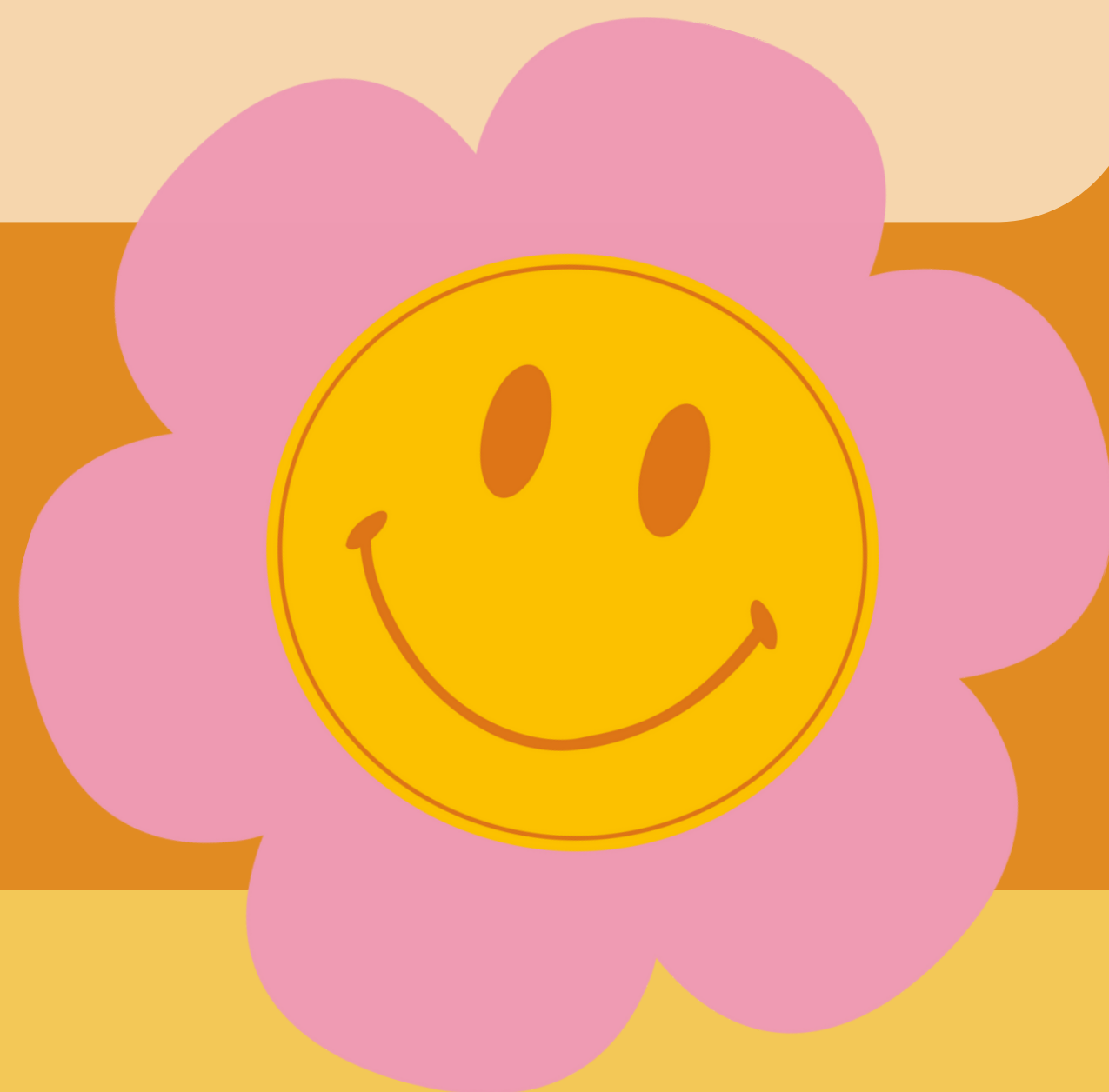
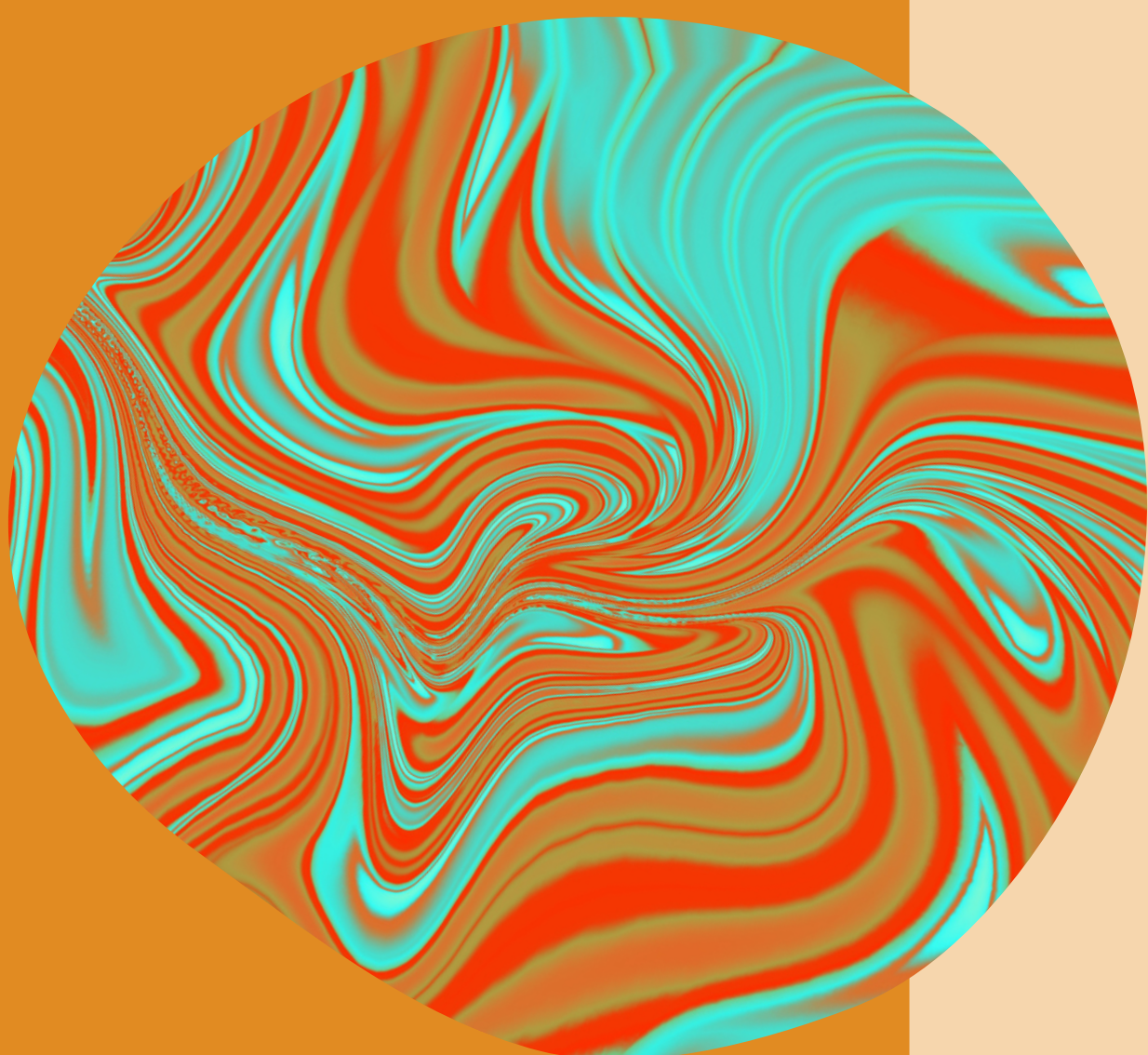




# Settling In
