SSD reviews your documentation and then rea ches out to schedule a meeting to discuss your needs

SERVICES PROVIDED

- Rashes
- Pink eye
- Sore throat
- Women's Health (birth control pills, Depo injections), vaginal infections
- Depo injections
- Asthma exacerbation
- Muscle sprains/strains
- Ear infections/ear cleaning
- Urinary tract infections
- Common cold, flu & upper respiratory infections

- Immunizations (fee applies)
 - TdaP (Tetanus, Diphtheria & Pertussis) \$65
- Suture removal (but not placement)
- STI services and testing -monthly, by appointment only
- Testing: strep, pregnancy, urine dipstick, blood sugar, mono, and COVID-19
- Allergy injections (maintenance doses only; patient provides serum)



WE DO NOT PROVIDE

- Pap smears
- Complete physical exams
- Blood work/laboratory tests
- Suture placement (removal only)
- X-rays or other imaging services
- Management for chronic conditions
- Management for long -term medication
- Diagnosis or treatment for ADD or ADHD

NOTE: Office visits/evaluations are free. If medication is needed, a prescription will be given.

We do not stock medications in the office
