# Crime Advisory

The Chicago Police Department is investigating an incident that occurred on September 20 at 11:55 a.m. near 9th and State Street. An offender, falsely claiming to be a Columbia student in need, solicited cash from an individual and when it was not provided, made verbal threats until they received cash.

# **General Safety Precautions**

- Remain alert.
- Buddy-up: travel in groups through well-lit and high-traffic areas after dark.
- Seek immediate shelter in a public establishment if you feel unsafe.
- Call 911 immediately if you are a victim or witness to a crime and provide a detailed description of the offender(s) including any physical/clothing identifiers in addition to any vehicle description and license plate information.
- If approached by a witness to an incident, request they remain on scene when possible or obtain contact information.
- Never pursue a fleeing assailant, provide information to the police.
- Inform Campus Security of any crime or safety concern.
